A Dodgeville man was charged with theft, drug possession, and felony strangulation, but he got off easy after Larry Nelson's plea deal.¹

While he was free, he was accused of committing heinous sex crimes against Wisconsin children.

When a reckless driver hit and killed a bicyclist, **Larry Nelson failed** to press charges.²

The cyclist's widow had to ask: "Not even a traffic ticket was issued. Why?" 3

When a motorcyclist crashed and left his passenger to die, Larry Nelson's plea deal resulted in the driver getting just one year in jail—even though the police report shows he was drinking and witnesses say that's why he fled the scene.⁴

The victim's mother said afterward:
"I feel you are getting off

far too easy!"5
